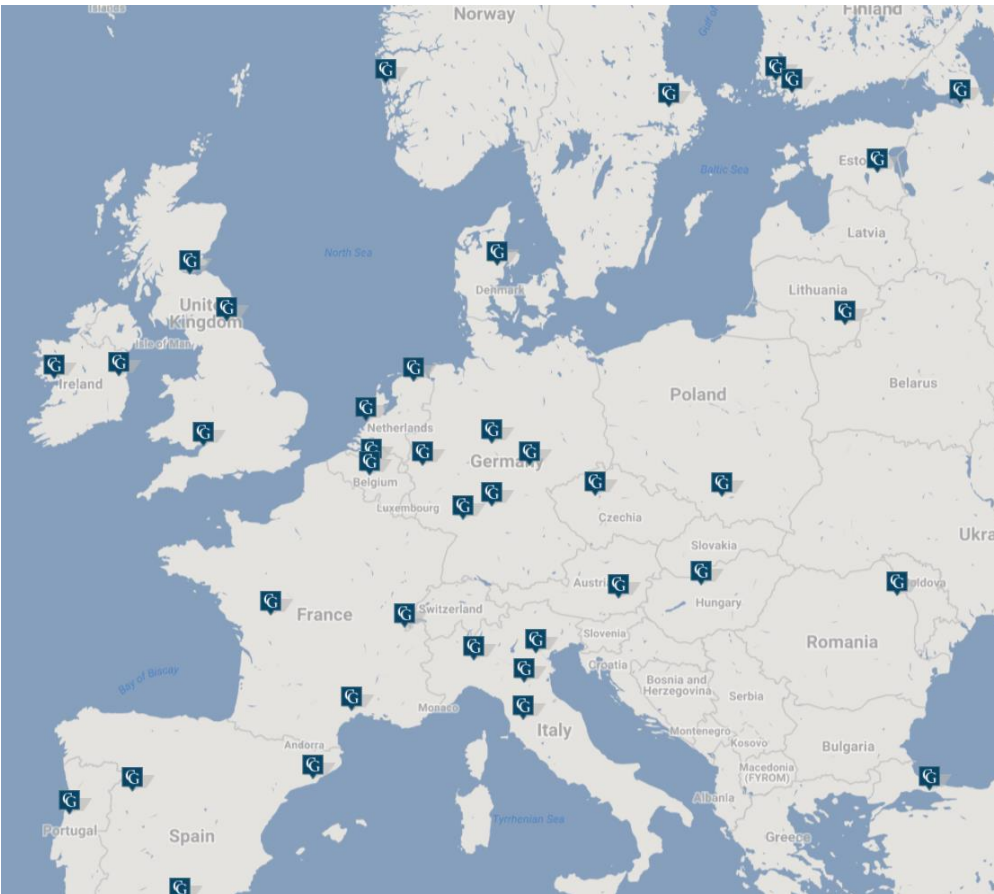
## COIMBRA GROUP: COMMITMENT
